Perth Youth Orchestra was founded on 7th June, 1962 by two Perth musicians - the late Louis Barnett and the late John Davie - with the support of a small number of parents, and gave its first concert on 25th June, in the 1964, under the baton of Louis Barnett, its first conductor. In the early years of its existence the orchestra was completely independent with only some assistance from the Education Authority, but since 1969 it has come under the control of the local education authority, as one of the senior Central Groups, rehearsing weekly throughout the winter months in the Perth Music Centre, and attending an annual week's Music Camp at Aberfoyle.

Beyond its winter season, the orchestra regularly performs during the Perth Festival of the Arts, the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, and in a variety of summer concerts at home and abroad. Perth and Kinross Council and the Gannochy Trust are our major sponsors, helping to develop the talent of young orchestral players in Perth and surrounding district. As a registered charity we also enjoy the support of our players' families, past and present, through their patron subscriptions and by their support at concerts and fund raising events.

Tonight, Michael O'Donnell from Scone, and Andrew Mann from Methven, continue a long Perth Youth Orchestra tradition in which members audition for a solo role with the orchestra. We are fortunate to have so many exceptionally gifted young musicians in the ranks of the orchestra. For part of this year's concert series, percussionist Alasdair Edmondston laid down his beaters to become our worthy soloist in the Shostakovich Piano Concerto No.2.

PYO is making its 21st appearance at this Edinburgh Festival of British Youth Orchestras. We haven't missed a single year and we are honoured to maintain this unique link with an event which does so much to foster the development of our country's young musicians.

In tonight's concert, Mr D. Eoin Bennet, takes his final bow with the orchestra. After his thirty years of dedicated service it is impossible to imagine Perth Youth Orchestra without Eoin's gentle persistence, his close attention to detail, but above all, his capacity to encourage and nurture the very best from our young musicians. The high standards he has set us are a legacy we must endeavour to sustain. We wish him a long and active retirement.


