Since then life has been difficult for these young musicians, with music lessons curtailed and group music impossible in person. Orchestra and band members on stage today have shown great determination in continuing to play despite the difficulties, and we are grateful to tutors who continued to teach in difficult circumstances. We are also very grateful to the tutors who have made this music camp possible.

Inevitably some players have given up and PYO is reduced in size. We are optimistic about the future however, as there are many pupils taking up instruments following the Scottish Government's abolition of fees for instrumental music lessons. We hope that this initiative will be carried through to future years.

It has been wonderful hearing PYO and other bands once again playing at Perform in Perth and at the traditional March end of term concerts. We look forward to more performances this summer: the Perth Festival service on 22 May, the concert in Greyfriars Kirk, Edinburgh, on 25th August and another concert in Perth Concert Hall on 29th August.
