Perth Youth Orchestra (Młodzieżowa Orkiestra z Perth) powstała w czerwcu 1962 roku z inicjatywy dwóch lokalnych muzyków – Louisa Barnetta i Johna Daviego – przy wsparciu grupy rodziców. Pierwszy koncert odbył się w 1964 roku pod batutą Louisa Barnetta.

W początkowym okresie swojego istnienia orkiestra działała samodzielnie przy skromnym wsparciu lokalnych władz oświatowych. Od 1969 roku władze te – w późniejszym okresie znane jako Perth and Kinross Council (Rada Perth i Kinross) – odgrywały znaczącą rolę w życiu orkiestry, zapewniając kadrę nauczycielską oraz lokale do prób zimą w Perth Music Centre. Główną atrakcją jest doroczna impreza muzyczna Music Camp w Aberfoyle usytuowanym w sercu bajecznie pięknego regionu Trossachs.

Przez ponad 30 lat Młodzieżową Orkiestrą z Perth kierował Eoin D. Bennett, którego zaangażowanie w rozwój młodych muzyków pozostaje wytyczną dla całego zespołu. Jego następca Allan Young oraz kilku innych nauczycieli należą do orkiestry.

Większość naszych młodych wykonawców oddaje się muzyce głównie dla przyjemności, ale są też i tacy, którzy w przyszłości podejmą studia muzyczne w kraju i za granicą.

Nasi soliści zostali wybrani z grona członków orkiestry – w tym roku są to Ruth Lindsay (skrzypce) i Sean Law (kontrabas).

Dziękujemy Polakom za gościnność. Serdecznie zapraszamy na nasze koncerty i liczymy, że uda się zbudować silną więź między naszymi krajami.

KRAKOW

Krakow is the former seat of the Polish kings, and is recognised by UNESCO centre for world heritage, Poland's vibrant second city has much to offer the discerning visitor. Locals and tourists alike are drawn to the historic Old Town Square, dominated by the Cloth Hall, its adjacent tower and the magnificent St Mary's Cathedral.

Perched on a hill overlooking the river Wisla, Wawel Castle and Cathedral reflect in their architecture the chequered history of foreign rule. The castle highlights the once exceptional wealth that the Royal Kings had at their disposal and the downward spiral that led to the country's fall from power.

The Jewish Quarter (Kasimierz) was used as the backdrop for many scenes in Schindler's List, and bears testament to the defiant nature of the Polish people. Evacuated during WWII, and left abandoned during the post war years, the area now is host to a plethora of lively bars, restaurants and jazz clubs.

WROCLAW

Wroclaw is one of Poland's oldest and most beautiful cities. Dating back to the 7th Century, the city stands on 12 islands with 112 bridges connecting them, giving the city the nickname of "Polish Venice".

The foundation of the city's University in the 18th Century helped Wroclaw's growth. To this day, the University is of the most important in Eastern Europe and has produced a number of Noble prize winners.

The city suffered extensive bomb damage during World War II but the impressive reconstruction project has left Wroclaw lacking none of its previous charm.

Wroclaw is now a thriving cultural centre and hosts many events each year including the Wratistavia Cantans International Festival, Jazz on the Odra, the Singing Actors Festival.



Conductor

Allan R. Young

Allan Young attended school in Perth and was co-leader of Perth Youth Orchestra before going on to study at the Royal College of Music and Drama in Glasgow. After graduating, Allan worked with young musicians in Perth and Kinross as a string instructor and in 1996 he was appointed Co-ordinator of Instrumental Instruction by Perth and Kinross Council. He leads a team of highly dedicated music teachers who deliver music instruction in schools throughout the council area.

Head of a talented musical family, Allan was already conductor of Perth Symphony Orchestra when he was appointed as conductor of Perth Youth Orchestra in 2000.

Rosanna Young (17)

Rosanna was born in Perth and began violin lessons aged 8 with Audrey Mattner. During her primary school years she played in the National Children's Orchestra, the highlight for her being the year Nicola Benedetti was invited to play a concerto. She joined Perth Youth Orchestra in primary seven and has since attended seven music camps and has had numerous opportunities to perform all over the country and abroad.

Rosanna joined the RSAMD junior department when she moved to secondary school where she studied for 5 years with Rebecca Rathbone and Angus Anderson in her final year. She was a member of both the JrRSAMD first orchestra and chamber orchestra and achieved her Grade 8 violin in 2006. Although Rosanna is a keen violinist, she intends to study piano full-time at the RSAMD in September.
